EAST RIVER PARK—A new artistic addition to East River Park went up last week and is sticking around till November. For their first New York City installation, husband-and-wife artists Gus and Lina Ocamposilva, who hail from South America, have created **12-foot-tall sculptures inspired by traditional ballet moves**—the grand jeté, adagio, and arabesque. Altogether, the fluid, colorful aluminum works are called "Dancers of the Wind"; they have been placed along the promenade of [East River Park](#), near the baseball fields just south of the East 10th Street footbridge.
